A Message from the CLAE President



Dear Members of CLAE

It is a great honour to serve as President of the CLAE since the fall of 2022. CLAE is a thriving organization and membership continues to increase as we all appreciate the many benefits of membership.

In the last month, Dr. Juhn Wada, co-founder of the CLAE and Past President died at the age of 99 years. He was a giant in the field of epilepsy at a time when we did not have all the advanced neuroimaging or genetic tools that we

have now. He was the quintessential clinician scientist before such a career path was recognized. Some details of his extraordinary life are summarized in the obituary in this newsletter as well as several other tributes to him in Epilepsia, Epilepsy Open, The Globe and Mail and The Vancouver Sun. He taught generations of neurologists and scientists who went on to have very successful careers. Dr. Wada was very proud of the CLAE and the work of Canadian clinicians and researchers in the epilepsy field. He kept up with the epilepsy literature and wrote scientific papers well into his retirement. I will always remember his compassion towards his patients and the attention he paid to their mental health and psychiatric comorbidity.

I would like to thank the members of the executive and board and the chairs and members of various committees of the CLAE for the excellent work that they do. The education committee under the excellent leadership of Dr. Esther Bui is currently very busy organizing the Annual Scientific Meeting of the CLAE meeting in Prince Edward Island in October 2023 and I am sure there will be a very exciting programme. I would like to encourage you to submit your work for presentation at this meeting and the abstract deadline is June 13th. The Medical Therapeutics Committee under the leadership of Dr. JP Appending has been very busy dealing with the never ending shortages of anti-seizure medications and advocating for access to new therapies. The Communications Committee under Dr. Todd Fantaneau keep us updated on all the activities of CLAE and currently working on restructuring the CLAE website. I would also like to thank the French language committee under Dr. Elisabeth Simard-Tremblay for their excellent work. I would also like to thank Dr. Mary Lou Smith who was co-chair of CPEN with Dr. Linda Huh for her excellent work and also the Global Health and Fundraising committees under Dr. Jorge Burneo and Dr. Lysa Boisse Lomax.

The COVID 19 pandemic has had a significant impact on the provision of care for many of our patients as well as on their mental health. Wait lists for video-EEG monitoring and epilepsy surgery have increased in many provinces but finally these delays are being addressed. Shortages of neurophysiology technologists and nurses also continue to impact delivery of care. On the other hand, the integration and expansion of telehealth has improved access to epilepsy care for many patients who live remote from major epilepsy centres and has also had a financial benefit for many of our patients. Telehealth will not replace in person consultation but the benefits are considerable. Issues of equity of care remain and research to address this is of great import.

Currently in Western Canada, the impact of climate change is very evident. As I write, there are over 90 forest fires burning in Alberta and many in BC. Many families have had to evacuate their homes and properties and every year the situation worsens. It is difficult to know how it will end but there is no doubt that climate change will have a major impact on individuals with epilepsy as

well as the general population. I hope you and your families have an enjoyable summer and some time to rest and recharge. I look forward to meeting you in Prince Edward Island in October.
