In Memoriam

Dr. Robert Mark Sadler



It is with deep sadness that we announce the death of Dr. Robert Mark Sadler, age 70, on December 26, 2023, in Halifax, Nova Scotia, after a brief illness.

Mark was born in Saint John, New Brunswick to Robert and Shirley (Fulton) Sadler. He is survived by wife Keltie English, daughters Meredith (Luke Siemens) and Leigh (William Mackay), grandson Henry Mackay, brothers David (Paula Barry) and John (Barbara Sadler), and numerous nieces and nephews. After obtaining his medical degree at Dalhousie University in 1977, Mark completed a Neurology residency and Epilepsy fellowship at the University of Western Ontario. He started his practice in St. John's, Newfoundland, then returned to Halifax in 1988 for the remainder of his career where he was Professor of Medicine (Neurology) at Dalhousie University. He served as Neurology Residency Program Director at Dalhousie University from 1995-2001.

For decades, Mark was the leading light in epilepsy care in Atlantic Canada. He was pivotal in establishing a state of the art 4-bed Epilepsy Monitoring Unit at the Queen Elizabeth II Health Sciences Centre and the only comprehensive epilepsy surgical programme in Atlantic Canada. He served terms as President for the Canadian League Against Epilepsy, Chief Examiner for the Canadian Society of Clinical Neurophysiologists EEG Examination, and Vice-President for Epilepsy Canada.

It is impossible to quantify the impact that Mark has had on thousands of people with epilepsy and their families. He will be greatly missed by his family and a global network of friends and colleagues.

Autoimmune Epilepsies Survey




New Health Care Initiative



To address ongoing clinical and healthcare system challenges facing epilepsy in Ontario, all existing provincial epilepsy-related programs, resources and stakeholders have been unified into a clinical and community network, designated OPEN (Ontario Provincial Epilepsy Network). This is a clinical network, modelled on the Alberta Strategic Clinical Network model, whose aim is to integrate clinicians and consumers and identify and address systems-based healthcare problems in order to improve delivery of care.

Its aim is to serve in an advisory capacity to the Ministry of Health in epilepsy related matters in Ontario.
